



Integrated Solid Waste Management on the Greek Islands

Phase One: Data collection and analysis

- 1.1. Critical review of all legislative texts related to solid waste management (international, European and national legislation).
- 1.2. Critical review of case-laws related to solid waste management on the islands and annotation of related decisions.
- 1.3. Collection of references.
- 1.4. Inventorying the current situation of solid waste management on the Greek islands via a questionnaire, which will be completed by all local stakeholders.

Phase Two: Evaluation

- 2.1. Evaluation of the current situation (insular particularities, practices, quantity and quality of produced waste, equipment, stakeholders, research for good practices and already used methods on insular regions and other countries, such as France and Italy).
- 2.2. Necessities evaluation:
 - Identification of deficiencies and other obstacles to be confronted in order to move onto an integrated waste management.
 - Legislative and statutory dimension, other tools, such as, environmental taxes, sensitization of the public.
 - Control of the sources of waste production: tourism, domestic waste, sensitization of the public, industrial and commercial activities, etc.
 - Control of the waste management cycle: collection, transport, recycling and in situ re-use.
